St Philip's Day

The feast of our Holy Father St Philip is transferred to next Tuesday, because Trinity Sunday falls on the usual date this year. On Monday 27 May at 6:30pm there will be choral First Vespers, Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament and veneration of St Philip's relic. First Vespers will be followed by a drinks reception, to which all are welcome.

On Tuesday 28 May, St Philip's Day, the Apostolic Nuncio, Archbishop Miguel Maury Buendía, will celebrate Solemn Pontifical Mass and preach at 6pm.

NOVENA TO ST PHILIP Our annual novena in preparation for the feast of our Holy Father St Philip continues after Vespers this evening, each weekday evening at 6:30pm, at 6:00pm on Saturday, and ends after Vespers next Sunday. Bring your prayer intentions on a piece of paper or use the ones provided to place in the box in St Philip's chapel. We will pray for all of these intentions, through the intercession of our Holy Father, throughout the novena.
